Dr. Corinna Lathan To Discuss Abilities of Brain Health Assessment Tool, DANA, and its Mental Health Impact for Military on November 4 in Annapolis, Md.

WHAT: Dr. Corinna Lathan ([@clathan](#)), AnthroTronix board chair and CEO, will speak on the [Military Mental Health](#) panel to discuss the abilities of FDA-cleared brain health assessment tool, DANA, and the value it provides military service members. DANA was initially developed through funding from the U.S. Navy Bureau of Medicine and Surgery and a Rapid Innovation Fund award by the U.S. Army to help evaluate the medical status of deployed military service members.

The session will be moderated by WYPR's Sheilah Kast, and will include Kate Sullivan, director of the Brain Fitness Center at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center, and Justin Sanchez, program manager at the Biological Technologies Office (BTO) of the Defense Advanced Research Project Agency (DARPA) as fellow panelists.

DANA, which received FDA clearance in October 2014, is a mobile medical app that can be used on a phone or tablet and works on both the Android and iOS operating systems. It's a game-like tool that can provide data within minutes to help assess and measure a person's brain/cognitive health. The app can help clinicians as a diagnostic tool when looking at concussion, depression, dementia/Alzheimer's Disease, eating disorders, and Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). For the military, DANA detects and assesses changes in cognitive functioning that can distinguish between the effects of mild, moderate, and severe PTSD, depression, and fatigue, as well as from multiple lifetime concussions.
